Debbie Blakely was elected Council President, the first woman to hold that post since fellow Councilwoman Chris Ciaccio in 2011.


Mike Todd was elected Vice President. Each will serve in their respective roles for one year until the next reorganization election.

Council News & Notes:

Township Council has heard the concerns from Windsor residents regarding widespread speculation regarding the closing of the Post Office there. Although this is a federal government issue, Council has listened and passed a Resolution 2023-31 at the January 26 meeting asking Congressman Andy Kim and NJ Senators Corey Booker and Robert Menendez to intervene. We will continue to advocate for the residents of Windsor and have been assured that mail service will not be interrupted. Ample notice of any changes regarding the status of the Windsor Post Office will be provided to its residents by the USPS.

Mike Todd and Chris Ciaccio attended the latest Mercer County Commissioners meeting in Trenton on Thursday, January 12. Mr. Todd urged the Commissioners to continue advocating for change in the Mercer County election process until substantive changes are made to ensure that every vote is counted.

Via Resolution 2023-30, Council has formally closed the proposed “Change of Use” of the Thompson Tract/Cubberly Farms (Block 5, Lot 1) now that a bid to continue farming the land for soybeans and corn was awarded on December 9, 2022. Additionally, Council approved the mayor’s appointments to Township Committees for 2023. We would like to thank all the residents who serve on Township Committees/Boards and truly appreciate all the time they dedicate to serve our community.
