The Robbinsville Township Governing Body Newsletter

The Robbinsville Township 2025 municipal budget, totaling \$32 million, reflects a strategic commitment to fiscal responsibility, public safety, infrastructure enhancement, and community well-being. For the 11th time in 14 years, the municipal tax rate will be either flat or reduced, and the 57.7 cents per \$100 of assessed value is the same rate as 2023 and 2024, thus helping to ensure continued affordability for residents. This stability is achieved despite rising costs in health insurance, pensions, utilities, and snow removal, demonstrating the Township's effective financial management.

Found within this year's budget is a significant investment directed toward public safety, including the renovation of the facility at 2300 Route 33, which will house the police department, municipal court, and other key departments. Additionally, Emergency Medical Services (EMS) have been brought in-house, ensuring more direct and responsive care for the community.

The budget allocates funds for substantial infrastructure improvements, notably the construction of a mile-long trail at Miry Run, promoting recreation and wellness. These projects aim to enhance the quality of life for residents and support sustainable community development.

The capital improvement program includes a total investment of \$44.7 million, funded through budget appropriations, capital improvement funds, grants, and authorized debt. Notably, the Township secured \$600,000 in state funding to upgrade the 911 system in collaboration with Hightstown, greatly enhancing emergency response capabilities.

The 2025 introduced budget, currently available for viewing at www.robbinsville.net, underscores Robbinsville Township's dedication to maintaining tax stability while investing in essential services and infrastructure. Through prudent financial planning and strategic investments, the Township continues to foster a safe, vibrant, and resilient community for all residents.

Residents can review budgets and other financial documents since 2013 on the Township website. Public hearing and vote on the 2025 budget adoption is scheduled for Thursday, May 22, 2025 at 7 p.m. inside the Robbinsville Township Public Meeting Room, located at 2298 Route 33.
